Distribute our tools and framework widely and effectively across various channels.



Equipping the Church

The Chalmers Center equips church leaders across the country to help their congregations build deeper relationships with people in poverty.

Located in the Broadmoor neighborhood of Jackson, MS, Redeemer Church Jackson is a multiethnic church that seeks to engage with materially poor people in their community through a housing renovation initiative, programs for youth and children, and other ministries.

Lay leaders like Levi & Kateri Gill are at the heart of Redeemer's efforts to serve their city. In 2017, Chalmers trained the Gills to start a *Work Life* jobs-preparedness class at Redeemer. Since then, they've mobilized a team of leaders and volunteers at the church and launched their *Work Life* ministry.

But after successfully running two classes, Levi and Kateri realized something was missing: people! Even though *Work Life* participants benefited from the class and found jobs, only a few signed up each time Redeemer offered the class.

"We're a diverse congregation, but economically we're all very similar," Levi says. "The church just didn't know many low-income people in the community to invite."

They decided to put Work Life on hold temporarily and find ways for the church to build stronger relationships with their neighbors in Jackson. That's when they discovered Are You a Good Neighbor?, an online resource from Chalmers designed to help churches know and love people who are poor in their communities.

The Gills offered *Are You a Good*Neighbor? as a Sunday school class at their church. Every week, a group



of 20-30 people watched videos, discussed what they were learning, and prayed. Together, they deepened their understanding of poverty and explored new ways to engage with their neighborhood.

The class sparked a valuable ongoing conversation at Redeemer, strengthening the existing Work Life team and getting new people interested in getting trained to serve as mentors in the class.

The Chalmers Center reaches local churches around the world through our local partners in West Africa and strategic partners like Compassion International, Tearfund, and HOPE International. Together with these partners, we have:

2019

- Equipped 2,723 churches and organizations
- Reached 150,711 people

- Equipped 8,714 churches and organizations
- Reached 860,147 people









Analysis of Support

As we enter into the future of serving the church and the new year of opportunities, I am especially grateful for you and all of our ministry partners.




